I. **CALL TO ORDER**

II. **INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS**

- Donna Mayer was introduced by Danielle as the new Health Emergency Management Chief. Donna, Danielle and Mike will continue to manage the program together.
- Calvin Fakkema introduced Harving Parra as the new EOC manager at CHOC.

III. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** – The December 13, 2018 meeting minutes were deferred, and the January 24, 2019 meeting minutes were approved.

IV. **EMS/HEM REPORT**

- **Health Emergency Management (HEM) Program** – The “How to contact the EMS Duty Officer Flow Chart” will stay in effect for now, but it will be changing. A flash report will be introduced before the May exercise. This is to be consistent with state EOM. EMS-HEM will no longer be utilizing the 2016 course catalog. 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5. Old Business	<p>There are only two facilities, CHOC and Kaiser that are still outstanding on the NDMS MOU. This will be removed from the agenda in the future.</p> <p>Goals for the meeting are listed at the top of the agenda.</p> <p>Mintie training was completed at Placentia-Linda Hospital. Everyone set it up or tried for the drill. Please send any pictures from the drill to Jason. There was a lot of discussion regarding whether people actually tried to identify where they would set this up in a real event.</p>																				
6. New Business	<p>There is an attachment that ranks the hospitals (blinded) from top to bottom in order of percentage of objectives completed in the drill. The percentages ranged from 40% to 100%. One of the objectives was to contact OC EMS via the HEAR radio. Only 7 of the 15 hospitals accomplished this objective. Another objective was to complete a 213RR via email as well as via ReddiNet. 3 facilities completed this objective. Another 12 completed the request in one of the modalities. There was a lot of discussion regarding the HEAR and 213RR objectives and the difficulties that hospitals faced.</p>																				

	<p>Priorities, Performance measures, and Plans are the focus of 2019.</p> <p>2019 Goals</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. HCC Preparedness plan 2. HCC Response plan 3. TRAIN evacuation plan 4. Surge plans 5. Family reunification plans 6. Continuity of Operations plans 7. Equipment <p>There have been questions about the budget and funding decisions. The plan is to use the leftover grant funds to bring everyone to par on the equipment that the County has with each facility and then hold each facility accountable for the supplies.</p> <p>There was a discussion about expired supplies, especially in the cages. They will be removed from the inventory.</p> <p>There was discussion on the use of the new Kaiser model of HVA and utilizing it for the County HVA in 2019. There was a lot of discussion on pros and cons. A poll will be sent out and then it will be brought back for a decision in Jan. 2019.</p>
<p>7. Drills</p>	<p><u>SWMHE</u> The After Action Meeting will be at the Public Health Training Center on 12/13 from 14-1600.</p> <p><u>2019 Spring Exercise</u> The exercise date is 5/16/2019. The scenario is a train wreck due to a computer glitch. There may be a chemical component. We need to look at testing medical counter measures, MCI/Trauma/Surge plans.</p> <p><u>FCC Drill – Aug14, 2019</u></p> <p>There was a discussion regarding concepts & objective for this drill after this meeting. (See attachment). It will be a full scale drill with patient movement. There will be an initial planning meeting in Jan, a mid-planning meeting in April, and a final planning meeting in July.</p>
<p>8. Other Agency Updates</p>	<p><u>FCC</u> The tentative date of the FCC full scale exercise is 8/14/2019. Mike is planning for “lots of patients” and “2-3 aircraft”. There will be a concepts and objectives meeting on 12/13 after the OC MAD meeting and before the C/E training.</p>
